Attendance

Attendance in schools has been in the headlines a great deal recently as there are worrying trends across the country of children not being in school when they should be. Our school is no different, and our aim is for children to be in school at least 95% of the time.


We do know that you have a dilemma when it comes to child sickness- do you sent them in when you know they are poorly, do you keep them at home, if you send them in will we just call you to collect etc. There is no easy answer to this, however we would encourage you to send children in to school if they have a mild illness such as a cough or a cold, or if they are feeling a little under the weather but with no specific symptoms, as we can always ring you if we see symptoms getting worse. Other things are more clear, such as if they have a temperature above 38 degrees or have vomitted, when they should remain at home. We don't give out '100% Attendance' certificates, which were used in the past by schools to celebrate this, as it was recognised that many children may not have 100% attendance and this is in no way their fault, but we do track the % per class and share this with children in assemblies so they can try to get 'their' number as high as possible.

Census day

The Department of Education undertakes three census days per year, with the next one being on Thursday 18th January. A lot of the data they capture is very routine around demographics of the children, however they also base an element of our overall budget on the children who have a school meal that day, which can amount to several thousand pounds.



We would like as many children as possible to have lunch that day, and although we provide a wonderful meal every day, the menu has been adapted to attract as many children as possible! We will provide a school meal for every child entitled to a free meal on the census day (younger children and those in receipt of FSM allowance), however if your child is in KS2 could we encourage you to book them in for a meal so that we can support the budget as much as possible.


