Traffic requests from us!

We know that the road layout and parking is already a challenge, with some of the improvements and road markings helping a little. However, cars are still parking on the corners/ junctions of the road which is making it unsafe for children trying to cross. Please can you park sensibly, even if this means walking the last small distance to school as we all have a responsibility to keep children safe when walking to and from school. Speed of cars is also a problem- whilst we have spoken to the housing developers in the past about construction traffic, the problem at the moment is our own families who are driving too quickly around the area. Just a few miles an hour can make a huge difference in spotting hazards and being able to brake in time, let alone the injuries that could be sustained if anyone was to actually get hit by a car. Please drive slowly in the area of the school.

School branded clothing

Our Governing Body discussed the possibility of including some school branded tops as an option for families in the future at their last meeting. This would not change the Educate Together principles in any way, and we would remain a school where children can choose what clothing they would like to wear (within reason!), however we have also had feedback from a number of families who would at least like an option of having a school branded top. We will therefore be putting out a questionnaire to families next week to gather opinions on the matter, as well as talking to the children in school before any decision is taken. Just to reinforce- this is NOT about making us a 'uniformed school' and this is not going to be enforced, it is just to ensure we are providing choice and a range of options for parents and carers.
