Introduction

The Government provides schools and academies with a Sports Premium to make additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport in order to benefit all pupils. The Trust is accountable to ensure that the spending is justified and in line with the criteria.

At Educate Together we pride ourselves in the PE and sporting opportunities we offer the children, where we aim for every child to participate in a sport or activity that they are able to sustain for life.

Sports Premium 2022/23 Evaluation

Teaching of PE through dedicated sports coach alongside teaching staff has proved to be very beneficial. Teaching staff are enhancing their teaching skills under the framework of the Real PE scheme. Consideration will need to be made of a further INSET during the next academic year in Real PE due to the increasing numbers of staff.

New resources continue to stimulate activity with the children, although some items have a short lifespan and need to be replaced frequently. New goalposts are needed, and new allocation below includes set of metal posts that should be longer lasting.

School Partnership is valuable, especially with activities such as Dance where we participate with a wider network of schools. An aspiration for us is to identify coaches for team sports so that the school can participate more in other things the Partnership offer such as fixtures.

External providers such as Boogie Beats is very well received, with music and movement included in all three Early Years classes on a regular basis. This may be extended to Year 1 in the next year.

The Sports Premium funding has been particularly valuable in ensuring the quality of resources available for the children is good, with a range of items to get as many children as possible engaged.
