Introduction

The Government provides schools and academies with a Sports Premium to make additional and sustainable improvements to the provision of PE and sport in order to benefit all pupils. The Trust is accountable to ensure that the spending is justified and in line with the criteria.

At Educate Together we pride ourselves in the PE and sporting opportunities we offer the children, where we aim for every child to participate in a sport or activity that they are able to sustain for life.

Evaluation of spending from previous year can be found below, along with the spending plan for 2021/22. Unfortunately many of the plans for the year 202/21 had to be changed due to school closures, however funds were allocated to Real PE training for staff at the cost of £2,500 plus equipment purchased for PE teaching as well as unstructured times of the day, along with additional storage).

Allocated PE times each week for all classes in school.	This was significantly impacted by covid 19, however all children received quality sports teaching for at least 2 hours per week, plus towards the end of the year we introduced a new scheme (Real PE) to ensure the quality remained high.
